## POSSIBLE INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS IN LEWES

This list is provided to the Town Council to give consideration to prior to their receiving any CIL money for use on infrastructure projects. It is appreciated that some of the projects are expensive and may well be candidates for grants from the CIL money that the NPA retains. It is also appreciated that many are projects that should be provided by other statutory authorities in exercising their responsibilities but sometimes a contribution from the Town Council can mean that the project is brought forward or an enhanced result is obtained. No significance should be attached to the order in which these possible projects have been listed.

- 1) Providing a riverside path on the east side between Timberyard Lane & Cliffe Bridge and on the west side between Cliffe Bridge & Willeys Bridge.
- 2) Contributing to improvements to Earwig Corner road junction.
- 3) Restoring the brick pavers and cobbles in Keere Street to former glory
- 4) Replacing any tarmac or other inappropriate material in the pavements in the conservation area with traditional materials
- 5) Ensuring that enhanced street furniture is provided in the Conservation Areas whilst reducing street clutter and having more comprehensive signposting of footpath and cycle routes in the town and to the adjoining countryside.
- 6) Completing National cycle path 90 through the town and the cycle path from Lewes down the Ouse valley.
- 7) Creating a suitable bus interchange point to replace the run-down bus station
- 8) Planting trees or shrubs at suitable places around the town.
- 9) Undergrounding or removing overhead wires attached to buildings in the Conservation Area
- 10) Providing a proper park for visiting coaches with facilities for their drivers possibly behind Homebase on land formerly owned by Tesco.
- 11) Completing the real time passenger transport information at bus stops and improvements at Lewes Prison (eastbound) and upper High Street (westbound).
- 12) Improving the ambience of Fisher Street.
- 13) Providing public toilets close to the Priory remains and in Western Road.
- 14) Contributing to the proposal to create a Peace Garden within the castle walls.
- 15) Completing flood defences along the riverbank where they are not planned to be provided
- 16) Contributing to studies or other measures aimed at re-opening the railway line to Uckfield.
